

ADT – Reports – Help ICD-9-CM Convert to ICD-10-CM

This report is meant to serve as a look at your facility’s ICD-9 codes and the ICD-10 areas where a coder should investigate when doing ICD-10 Codes. You cannot use it for coding. As you know, ICD-10 codes incorporate much greater specificity than the ICD-9 codes. There are 2,983 valid ICD-9 codes and 69,823 valid ICD-10 codes. The crosswalk cannot take you to the correct ICD-10 code because the level of specificity simply does not exist in ICD-9. **The report goes to the least specific code where an exact equivalent code does exist -- not to the correct code.** The following text describing this situation exists throughout the report:

Approximately Equivalent (ICD-9-CM ~ ICD-10-CM)

- The source system is less specific than the target system along the laterality axis of classification
- The target system classification contains both specific and less specific laterality translation alternatives
- Only the less specific laterality translation alternative is included as an entry

For example: The L89.309 is unspecified as to location or stage but there is no ICD-9 information to do otherwise.

707.05 - Pressure Ulcer Buttock
 L89.309 - Pressure ulcer of unspecified buttock, unspecified stage

Below is a small portion of the many, many possible ICD-10 choices:

We do not envision anyone using the report to code. It was meant as a way to help people start to familiarize themselves with the general areas in the ICD-10 codes that appear most frequently in your population.

Given this situation you should NOT think that the codes listed in the report should be used. They are simply a GUIDE to the general area of the ICD-10. Only you will be able to determine which of the many codes applies to each individual situation.

If you want to look up specific residents within the ALL report, just save the report to a PDF and put it on your desktop for reference. A PDF allows an easy search and you can quickly find a specific resident.

Reminder:

You have the ability to print Face Sheets prior to October 1st that include the ICD-10 codes. You may wish to do this now simply to compare to the current face sheet to be sure that you have dual coded all of the current diagnoses.

Use the drop down to select ICD-9 only, ICD-10 only, or both.
